Week 1	 Focus: Gallery Visit Learn about the work of artist Bridget Riley and view her work first hand. To experiment with a range materials and processes in response to Riley's work. Week 3	Focus: Dissecting a piece of work and transposing ideas.	Choosing an inspiring piece of impressionist/post art, analysing and understanding a piece of work. Pupils to use the Impressionist Art Books to find their favourite painting to inspire their Riley response. Pupil to analyse the work using the looking at art worksheet. Homework: Detailed analysis of chosen piece and artist.	Gain a better understanding of analysing a piece of work. Group critic and discussion of work produced in the lesson. Group work, peer teaching Homework taken in for marking Develop confidence realising from the initial concept to production. Week 4	Focus: Visual analyse and abstraction. Creating pattern and designing a final outcome.	Breaking down the colour, create a colour chart of max 10 main colours. Simplify the shapes, or marks and reduce the colour. Discuss in pairs ideas for the shape and colour choices. Create three compositional experiments using five chosen colours and shapes. Group plenary as a class to discuss final choices. Homework: Develop compositional ideas and come up with a final painting plan	Group critic and discussion of work produced in the lesson. Develop understanding of transposing and abstracting to create original pieces of work.	G&T extension task: create mini compositional pieces. Week 5	Focus: Colour mixing and experimenting with paint and masking techniques.	Colour mixing to match colour choices from last lesson, working in pairs to advise and guide each other with colour mixing. Pupils will experiment with the masking processes to create mini example paintings of their planned final piece. Homework: Use worksheet to analyse B Riley's work and start thinking about own ideas. Week 6	Focus: Preparing to create final outcome.	Pupil to finish colour mixing and prepare stencils for final painting, some to be hand cut and some to be designed and cut digitally. Homework: Document the process of how the final piece will be made, including the order of production.	Working on a large scale, understanding scaling up. Understanding an artist's process.	G&T extension task: create more complex stencil shapes on Photoshop or Illustrator. SEN &EAL: Vocabulary sheet key words, including definitions. Additional support: one to one assistance with colour mixing Email homework info out to pupils
Week 7	Focus: Painting the final painting	Pupils should be able to create the painting quite rapidly because of all the preparation in the previous lessons. Homework: Review and evaluate the painting.		G&T extension task: create an additional smaller painting using overlapping stencils. Additional support: one to one assistance with placing stencils.
