Regular Communication

We use a number of ways to communicate with you and

these are outlined below:

Weekly Highlights	This is where we celebrate our students' achievements (both in and out of school) on the school website <u>here</u> . A link is circulated each week.
Parent Newsletters	These do not follow a regular pattern but are published when there is information to circulate. They are distributed via SchoolPost and available on the school website <u>here.</u>
Crescendo	This is our official magazine and features articles about the work of the school and contributions from the staff and student body. It is published once every half term <u>here</u> .
Principal's Update	If you receive a message via SchoolPost entitled Principal's Update the message will contain important and possibly urgent information which we would ask you to read as soon as you can. We have published more of these over the past 14 months than we would usually anticipate (!) but there will be times when I need to inform you of something important and this designation is an easy way for you to know that the message should be read immediately.

I hope this is a helpful start point, but do please call us (or drop us a line) if you need any further information or assistance at any time.

I am much looking forward to seeing you soon whether that will be at a concert, a visit or just in the carpark when you are undertaking the "School-run"! Do feel free to stop me for a chat if you see me around – it is always lovely to see you.
