Director of Boarding

Lady Kate Cayley will be moving on from the school at the end of the autumn term to enjoy a more relaxed lifestyle in the beautiful Northeast. I am delighted to announce that we have appointed Jane Mitchell as Kate's successor who joins the School staff in September to overlap with Kate. Jane is an incredibly well-qualified and experienced senior leader who has worked in a variety of roles in a variety of different situations. Students and some staff met Jane at her interview and were all impressed by her warmth and wisdom. Jane will be with us in person during the first week of the new academic year and thereafter will work largely remotely for the rest of the term, with some visits to the school.

Jane writes to introduce herself:

'I am so delighted to have the opportunity to work at The Purcell School. I have a wealth of pastoral expertise having enjoyed seven years as a Houseparent at Repton School in Derbyshire and five years at Lord Wandsworth College. More recently I was Director of

Wellbeing and Head of PSHEE at Lord Wandsworth College. We won the Independent School of the Year Award for Student Wellbeing in 2020 for our comprehensive and compassionate approach to the wellbeing of our students.

Nurturing young people and being able to walk alongside them as they find their place in the world has always been an honour. It is a complex and sometimes confusing world for young people and I believe they need strong role-models who are empathic listeners, full of hope for the future and able to make them feel valued whilst building the foundations for a strong sense of selfworth.

I have worked in a wide variety of schools from state comprehensive to private schools both in the UK and abroad and each school has taught me something new. I have also learnt so much from the young people I have worked with both in the classroom and in the boarding house. I have travelled extensively and worked with

socio-economically disadvantaged children and teenagers in Ecuador, Nepal and Italy, as well as teaching in the Calais Refugee camp.

Working at The Purcell School is a new challenge, and I am so excited to get to know each student next year and to ensure that their boarding experience continues to be exactly what they need to support them and care for them whilst on their journey at The Purcell School. The students who interviewed me and showed me round the school certainly inspired me. They were so charismatic. thoughtful, honest and kind (and super talented!). I am full of optimism for the years ahead, despite my obvious lack of musical talent!!'
