Dear Parents and Guardians,

Having now run through the first complete week of term it seems a good moment to send out the first of this year's Parent Newsletters.

I am pleased to say that the first week has run very smoothly with very few issues - logistical or otherwise. Our new students have settled into school life very quickly and seem to be establishing new friendships and our returning students have done an excellent job helping them feel welcome. There are always a few minor, individual ups and downs in the first few weeks, but we are well able to manage these as they arise.

Instrumental lessons start this week and this adds a further layer of complexity to the timetable and for new students to navigate. If they suggest to you that they are unsure where and when they need to be, please get in touch with your Houseparent and ask them to help guide them. We do expect our students to take an unusual amount of personal responsibility for managing their way around their commitments and this is an important "life lesson" for them. By and large they rise to this challenge fantastically; and where they do not, we're here to step in and support.

I'll take this opportunity to reiterate that if you are concerned about something, or if you are not sure whether something your son or daughter has told you seems right, please get in touch and share your concerns with us. It's much easier to fix a small problem when it is still a small problem; leaving it and letting it grow into something much bigger, always makes it harder to manage. The <u>Parent Handbook</u> has a handy list of who to contact with specific questions.

Communication

For those new to the School, we tend to use SchoolPost for our generic messaging to parents and email/phone to individuals. This Parent Newsletter is published roughly once every half term, but only if there is information to pass on. Our Weekly Highlights publication is where we regularly celebrate the

achievements of our students, alumni and staff. Occasionally, it is necessary to get an urgent or important message out to all parents or a group of parents. On these occasions, the title of the SchoolPost messages will be "Principal's Update" followed by a subject. If you see this in a SchoolPost message, please read it as

soon as possible because it is likely to be important and possibly time sensitive.

Last year, I said that I was going to revisit my hugely popular Vlogs and then spectacularly failed to produce a single one. I am going to try to do better this year so watch this space...!

Parent Code of Conduct

We are pleased to enjoy good relationships with our parents and the triangle between you, your child and the school is crucial to a smooth school journey for all. However, like all schools, we have sadly seen an increase in aggressive and confrontational communication (either in writing, phone or

person) from a tiny number of parents. Because of this we have a <u>Parent Code of Conduct</u> which sets out the terms under which we will communicate with you. As well as having a duty of care towards our students, I also have a duty of care towards our staff, and the School will not tolerate

any abusive, aggressive or confrontational communication with staff. Where you have concerns, we will always treat these seriously, but they should be stated dispassionately, factually and respectfully. I thank you in advance for your cooperation in this matter.
